REGULATION PHD IN BIOMEDICAL SCIENCES

TITLE 1 - General provisions

Art. 1 – Name

The name of the doctorate is Research Doctorate in Biomedical Sciences.

Art. 2 – Research topics

The main research areas are: Biochemistry, Pharmacology, Physiology, Neurology, Child Neuropsychiatry, Paediatrics, Psychiatry, Cardiology.

Art. 3 – Curricula

There are no curricula, but different tracks: Biochemistry, Pharmacology, Physiology, Medicine and Neuroscience.

Art. 4 – Proposing department and co-proposers

The proposing department is the Department of Brain and Behavioral Sciences.

Art. 5 – Form of institution

The PhD in Biomedical Sciences is established autonomously.

Art. 6 – Macroarea

The PhD in Biomedical Sciences is
Il Dottorato in Scienze Biomediche is included in the macroarea “Scienze della Vita”.

TITLE 2 - Organization

Art. 1 – Bodies

The bodies of the PhD in Biomedical Sciences are the Teaching Board, the Coordinator and the Deputy Coordinator.

Art. 2 – Quality assurance system



The AQ Group is made up of at least 2 teachers from different SSDs, belonging to the teaching board, and at least one representative of the doctoral students.

Art. 3 – PhD duration

Each cycle of the PhD in Biomedical Sciences lasts no less than 3 years.

Art. 4 – Annual poster of teaching/training activities

The teaching/training activities are available on the PhD website: <http://phdbms.unipv.it/>, under: Credits and Courses.

In the three years of the doctorate, the student must acquire 30 CFU to access the final exam, following optional or compulsory courses, periods abroad, workshops or seminars. At least 6 credits concern transversal teaching activities, with 3 credits acquired through the transversal training activities proposed by the SAFD and published on its website.

The attribution of credits is reported on the doctorate website, under: Credits and Courses.

Art. 5 – Training activities of a transversal nature/acquisition of transversal skills

The doctoral course promotes the acquisition of transversal skills through the participation of doctoral students in the training activities promoted by the SAFD pursuant to art. 6 par. 1 lett. h) of the University Regulations regarding research doctorates or through the participation of doctoral students in other initiatives promoted by different subjects, even external to the University of Pavia, which correspond, on the basis of a reasoned opinion of the teaching board expressed pursuant to art. 29 bis par. 3 of the University Regulations regarding research doctorates, for the purposes referred to in the aforementioned art. 6 par. 1 of the University Regulations and which are consistent with the doctoral student's research project.

TITLE 3 – Final and transitional provisions

Art. 1 – For anything not expressly provided for in this regulation, the provisions to observe are that contained in the University Regulations regarding research doctorates, referred to in the D.R. n. 900 of 11.4.2022 and subsequent amendments..

Art. 2 – This regulation is fully implemented for the cycles activated after its entry into force.

TITLE 4 – Entry into force

Art. 1 – This regulation, subject to ratification by the SAFD pursuant to art. 6 par. 1 lett. n) of the University Regulations regarding research doctorates, comes into force the day following publication on the doctoral course website.
